

Status of Mobile Coverage


Mobile Network Operators

- Airtel
- Established 1998
- Covers over 80% of the population (2019)
- 2G/3G/4G LTE
- TNM
- Established 1995
- Covers over 74% of the population (2019)
- 2G/3G/4G LTE
- MTL
- Oldest sole provider of fixed PSTN
- CDMA
- ACL
- Awarded licence in 2007, launched in 2010
- GSM/4G/CDMA

Positive: Coverage has extended.

Negative: Monopoly of 2 companies


Status of Mobile Coverage




Consequences

- Not affordable for most of the population
- e.g data bundle £1 £5/GB
- Slow rate of return on investment
- difficult for new entrants to roll out, risking breach of licence.
- constrained investment in network performance improvement, QoS guarantee, network upgrade e.g to 5G

- Leverage investments and Policies
 - Shared infrastructure (neutral InP)
 - Shared spectrum
 - Regulatory incentives, e.g. Licence exemption
- Industrial Networks
 - Mining e.g. mostly in remote areas not covered by MNOs.
 - Agriculture e.g. low-power networks for security requirements of Cannabis farms.
- Rural connectivity
 - Community networks
 - Connecting schools Covid pandemic is proof!
- Upscale Existing IoT Applications
 - Smart health care
 - Disaster early warning systems
